Purpose: The Building an Inclusive Health Care Workforce program builds a culturally and linguistically competent health care workforce that mirrors our diverse community. The program addresses the high demand for more staff and supports economic empowerment for under-employed residents. The program will increase ongoing student capacity by expanding health sciences laboratory spaces and developing hospital partnerships for clinical education sites. Outreach and wrap-around services will support the student pipeline, and educational and employment success.

Justification: This proposal offers low or no-cost training that allows new entrants to join the workforce and launch a career as the health care professionals we all need. Engaging underrepresented residents will create a more inclusive workforce, capable of offering culturally-appropriate care to a wider range of residents—while navigating trainees toward thriving careers. *Building an Inclusive Health Care Workforce: Lifting Underrepresented Residents into Health Care Careers* will prepare 200 new health care professionals in much-needed roles. This program represents the potential for a one-time investment to have long-lasting benefits: trainees who become essential healthcare workers and a community college with additional training lab resources for future workers across multiple healthcare disciplines.
